IN RESPONSE TO THE WAR in Israel, we launched Chesed for a Chayal to protect the chayalim of Chicago.

Through a shared spreadsheet, we asked our community to select a soldier who is on active duty, and keep that chayal in mind during their daily acts of chesed. People can also add names of soldiers to the spreadsheet to be 'adopted' as well. We know that the effects of chesed are boundless, and we hope that the z'chusim generated will provide extra protection during this perilous time.

A Farm Grows in Long Grove

THE INSTITUTE OF SOIL & SOUL'S INCREDIBLE PARTNERSHIP WITH CHESEDCHICAGO



Gabriel Gould has extra produce from his organic farm. ChesedChicago runs a food pantry.

It's a perfect match!

Meet Gabriel Gould – founder of The Institute of Soil & Soul in Long Grove, Illinois. This summer, Gabriel began donating some of his produce to our food pantry.

We sat down with Gabriel to discuss the origins of his farm and his community work.

Tell us about yourself and how you got into farming.

I was born in Glencoe, I don't come from an agricultural family. In 2018, I went to a yeshiva program; it was

one of my first experiences learning about Judaism. I come from a secular family, with very little Jewish educational background and I wanted to attain that. One day during morning prayers I asked Hashem for some guidance – what should I do after yeshiva? And I had this vision of horses. I'd never worked with horses before, but I took it pretty seriously as a sign. When yeshiva ended and I got back home, I made some calls to equine farms in the area. Eventually, I got connected to a family in Northbrook - they didn't have horses, but they had a fairly large garden, goats, and chickens, and that was the beginning of

my experience with horticulture.

I really wanted to donate the food, as that feels much more purposeful. Especially to people who don't have access to healthy organic foods.

intimate connection with Hashem through farming and caring for animals.

When was Soil and Soul founded?

The summer of 2020 was when we started our regenerative farm, Soil and Soul. We started growing vegetables and selling them to restaurants.

I always had a dream of starting a farm. In 2021 I started to look at properties around the area. I acquired the current property two and a half years ago, and I've been developing it slowly but surely, adding different elements.

What does a typical day on the farm look like?

We usually begin around 7:30 a.m. The farm is run by me, a few interns that come throughout the season, and some volunteers. We work until about 10:30 when we take a tea/coffee break, during which we study an essay about agriculture. We resume working at about 11:30. The day usually ends by 1 p.m. when we're ready for deliveries.

How did you get connected with ChesedChicago?

That was through the Polstein (Aryeh and Elisheva) family. I had

gotten connected with them about a year ago at a Shabbat dinner. They've been so pivotal in my Jewish identity development. I mentioned to them that I have all this extra produce and don't know what to

That summer was when I began to really feel Jewish. Because I started to see all the things I had learned in yeshiva, actually come to life on the farm. It was a very

do with it. I told them I really wanted to donate the food, as that feels much more purposeful. Especially to people who don't have access to healthy organic foods. And Aryeh told me that his mother works at ChesedChicago. The rest is history.

Which items have you given to ChesedChicago?

We've donated tomatoes, cucumbers, peppers, squash, zucchini and eggplant. Since we started, we've been donating 40-75 LB produce each week, during growing season.

Next year, all the produce we grow will be donated.

In your opinion, what is the most important thing ChesedChicago does?

Any act to help someone who is facing a challenging situation – to help uplift them or just support them

is tremendous. And ChesedChicago is doing that for 6500 people. To know that your institution's support is so beyond helpful, I can't even begin to describe how important that is. To help empower these families and help them get by.

Do you have an anecdote from your time with **ChesedChicago?**

The openness with which I've been received has been fantastic, and I like the weekly interactions I have at the warehouse with Anshie Kranczer.

What is your message to people considering volunteering at ChesedChicago?

Just get up, go do a good thing! It feels good. And there's plenty of opportunities so just take a risk; do something good today. 🚿

Produce and Bread Distribution

WHAT WE DO: Once a week, we distribute produce and bread, as well as some other donated items, to those who qualify.

WHERE DO WE GET THE ITEMS? We buy most of the produce and we also receive weekly donations from Whole Foods and Trader Joe's.

The bread is donated by Tel Aviv/Gratzia Bakery, Northshore Bakery, and Emma's Bagel Cafe.

We are incredibly grateful for the generosity of these donors, and are so lucky to be able to help the community through their donations!
